Minor Ailment Scheme:

Every year, millions of us visit our GP with minor health problems that our local pharmacist could resolve.

But by visiting your pharmacy instead, you could save yourself time and trouble. Instead of booking and waiting for a GP appointment, you can visit your local pharmacist any time – just walk in. What's more, many pharmacies are open in the evenings and on the weekends.

If everybody went to a pharmacist with common health problems, more time would be freed up for our GPs. This might make it easier to get a convenient appointment with your GP next time you need one.

So if you have a common health problem, a trip to your local pharmacy is an option.

Your pharmacist may be able to help with:

- skin conditions, such as mild acne and mild eczema
- coughs and colds, including nasal congestion and sore throat
- minor cuts and bruises
- constipation and haemorrhoids (piles)
- hay fever and allergies
- aches and pains, such as headaches, earache and back pain
- indigestion, diarrhoea and threadworms
- period pain and thrush
- warts and verrucas, mouth ulcers and cold sores
- athlete's foot
- nappy rash and teething

**Some pharmacies also provide truss fittings, stoma products and incontinence supplies.*

Please note that if you do not pay for your prescriptions the Pharmacy may be able to prescribe medication for the above conditions free of charge.
